

Our Christian Distinctive

At the heart of The King's College is our Christcentered mission, which embodies a deep commitment to loving God and others. Our focus on Christian education remains vital, as it reflects the foundational vision that led to the establishment of our school over 40 years ago, driven by a community parents desiring a distinctly Christian education.

Recent surveys affirm that this need persists, with insights from over 8,500 parents across 101 Christian schools in Australia:

- 1. Traditional Christian Values: Three in four parents prioritize traditional Christian values and beliefs when choosing a school.
- 2. Christian Teaching: Two in three parents consider Christian teaching for their child to be of high to extreme importance, valuing community service and Christian studies.
- 3. Alignment of Values: The primary reason parents select Christian schools is the alignment of values, with 54% citing this as the most significant factor. Additionally, 74% of parents view the teaching of traditional Christian values and beliefs as extremely or very important.

To remain true to our Christian distinctive, we are excited to announce several new initiatives following the appointment of our Director of Christian Teaching:

Director of Christian Teaching: This position will provide vital support to ensure alignment with our mission and values.

Daily Devotions: Prioritising daily devotions as a core practice in our Christian learning environment.

Scripture Memory Practice: Reestablishing scripture memory alongside the prestigious Golden Apple Award.

Founders' Film Project: A film project that captures the stories of our founders, sharing their vision and purpose with our community.

Staff Development Plan: Implementing an intentional staff development plan to ensure we remain faithful to our mission and values.

Guidance for Growth: Supporting the growth and development of educational pedagogy through a Biblical worldview.

It is crucial that Jesus Christ remains central to all aspects of our school's daily life—encompassing relationships, curriculum, assessments, special events, and more. If we stray from this focus, the fundamental distinctiveness of our Christian identity is at risk.

St Philip's Teaching Training Program

In mid-2024, The King's College proudly became an affiliate of St Philip's Teaching School, launching a Teacher Training Program aimed at developing highquality educators.

With the guidance and support of St Philip's, our trainees are immersed in a Christ-centred, hands-on teaching and learning environment from day one. We have kickstarted this initiative with two passionate trainee teachers, who have been a blessing in the classrooms in which they work.

Their progress is already having a positive impact on the learning community. This training program not only supports the development of confident, skilled educators, but also trains them at a level that goes beyond the traditional teacher training model.

By combining theoretical knowledge with practical experience and the guidance of dedicated mentors, the training program equips our graduates with a level of competence and readiness that surpasses what is typically achieved through conventional teacher training pathways. We are excited about the potential to expand this quality initiative into the next year and continue to sow into the next generation of educators.

Students

Our staff continues to champion the application of Christian values in every activity, whether on the sports field, science lab, stage, or playground. Our Christian Education programs in both Primary and Secondary schools undergird the wonderful work of staff who teach Christianly in all subject areas.

2024 Initiatives

Chapels | Under the training and mentorship and training of Dr Rev. Michael Battersby students lead all aspects of primary and secondary services.

Ministry Captains | Contributed to the College's spiritual culture, help coordinate chapels, run weekly prayer meetings, and answer students' faith questions.

Transformers | Three lunchtime discipleship programs encouraged students at different stages of their faith journey.

- Alpha | An amazing program run by staff and students at lunchtimes, attended by approximately 40 high schoolers to exploring the Christian faith.
- **GAP** | Standing for "God and Pizza" gave the opportunity for students to study their Bibles over one lunchtime each week.
- Vertical | a weekly student-run prayer meeting open to all.

Next year, the incoming Ministry Captains will commence a weekly discipleship bible study for students who want to follow Jesus.

Ongoing Programs

Kings Worship Academy trained students to lead worship and produce a ministry service. The Certificate IV students played a key role in demonstrating leadership in team building, creativity, programming and production.

Christian Education Program provided rigorous yet fun coverage of our most beloved and important biblical themes and is part of our Kindy – Year 10's regular landscape.

Encounter Days are whole-day incursions and excursions where our Year 11 and 12 students engage with guest ministry youth leaders. Many meaningful discussions and heart commitments to God are made at these events.

Global Leadership Summit (GLS) gathered 12 student leaders and captains, focusing on equipping them with essential skills for guiding our Year 6 students in a Christian leadership journey. The leaders then dedicated an entire day to Year 6 students, delivering sessions on life skills, goal-setting, and inspirational "buy-in" moments and activities to fuel their potential to execute ideas that will improve school life (and the planet)! Due to the success of our GLS model, the GLS executive team has invited us to speak at the 2025 State Leaders Summit, recognizing our efforts to cultivate young leaders with a vision for positive change.

Service Learning Program | As part of Christian Education Learning, our Years 5-9 students were provided an opportunity to demonstrate acts of love and compassion towards our school community, our local community, and the global community. This initiative inspired and provided an opportunity for our students to:

- Use their time and talents to spread God's love through positive contributions.
- Enjoy the benefits of freely serving and giving without expecting rewards.
- Learn to empathise with those less fortunate than themselves.
- Display ambassadorship for the College as they champion the virtues and values of our school.

Staff

The King's College also aims to grow and support each staff member's faith in a number of ways, including morning devotions, worship mornings, prayer meetings and theological conversations that ensue all contribute to a flourishing Christian ethos at the College. So many staff express gratitude for the nourishment and spiritual growth they experience in our staff family.

This year, we also launched the Exceptional Staff Course for all staff to complete over two years. In 2024, 46 staff completed the course, which gives an understanding of The King's College's purpose, beliefs and our culture—the why, what and how of our mission.

Our Community

Parents and Friends (P&F)

Following a successful re-launch in 2023, our P&F committee continues to enhance school life, fostering connections among parents through various initiatives.

2024 Highlights | Hosted Mother's Day and Father's Day stalls, and supported primary and secondary Sports Carnivals. Expanded involvement opportunities, including social events, classroom support, and fundraising.

New Initiatives | This year, a Year 6 Christian identity course for girls was introduced in partnership with a parent, with plans to extend this to secondary students in 2025.

Collaborative Efforts | The P&F collaborated with the secondary leadership team on fundraising for a new shelter near the basketball court.

The P&F goal is to meet regularly and engage more parents in continuing to build community, strengthen school ties, and increase parental involvement across all areas of school life.



Alumni

Our Alumni Program continues to strengthen school ties and enrich community life, fostering a lasting connection among graduates

Reunions and Participation | This year's Alumni Reunion, held for the Classes of 2019-2023, welcomed approximately 60 former students who reconnected over shared memories and a meal. Several alumni returned for Spirit Week and other events, sharing their experiences post-graduation with our Year 12 students.

Alumni Program Development | To foster a strong alumni network, we appointed two student alumni leaders to develop an alumni database and identify representatives for each year cohort. This initiative supports continued engagement, with alumni offering mentorship, leadership, and service to the school.









Generosity Day

Our Year 8 students participated in the Generosity Day, an annual initiative where students take the morning and serve the community in one of the following areas.

College Care | Beautifying and planting grass in primary school.

Our Performing Arts Program

Kings Worship Academy

Kings Worship Academy (KWA) is a unique initiative of our school where we not only train our Year 11/12 students in a real-world environment as they work towards their Certificate in IV music, but we also develop the skills of dozens of worship leaders and church music coordinators from around the city.

Our Year 12 students cover topics from songwriting, leadership, worship lifestyle, musicianship techniques, biblical understanding and contemporary production, to name a few. It's such a privilege to host a communityimpacting program and watch our burgeoning leaders interact with and serve others from the region. Because of the profile of KWA and our Christian emphasis in all things musical, we were invited to:

- Lead the Ministry times and chapels at other colleges including Mandurah Baptist College and Hillside Christian College.
- Governor's Prayer Breakfast where our choir and Creative Club team led a very moving time of worship and ministry for over 1300 community leaders, politicians, pastors and educators.
- Host the Youth Worship Summit, where 180 music and worship leaders from surrounding Christian schools spent a day with our team being mentored, sharing experiences and praying/playing together.

Music

Peripatetic Music Lessons | Approximately 90 students are receiving regular musical tuition in addition to their music classes and the VET program continues to be a strong pathway for our creative senior students. Tuition is available in piano, guitar, drums and voice.



Arts and Drama Program Highlights

YOH Fest (Youth on Health Arts Festival)

The 2024 theme was "Inclusion". Our entries included:

Art and Technologies Showcase

300 creative works were professionally curated and displayed from our Year 6-12 woodwork, textiles, media, photography and design and visual art students. The showcase was held in our dance studio over 3 days with an opening afternoon tea being held for students and their families including live music. The outstanding works from this exhibition will be entered into the KIC Art Exhibition. The arts team plan to hold this again next year with the addition of a performing arts showcase.

Drama Clubs and Performances

Primary Drama | 35 students (Years 2-6) participated in weekly rehearsals, culminating in the *Peter Pan* production.

Secondary Drama | 40 students (Years 7-9) participated in held weekly rehearsals, culminating to *Alice@Wonderland*.

Both shows were performed for primary students and then for family and friends, with creative club students managing production. Ticket sales saw strong attendance and positive reviews. Plans to enhance stage and production facilities will support larger future programs.

Arts Elective Subjects Expansion

The growing uptake of Dance and Drama led to these subjects being extended to Year 9 this year with classes at capacity. In 2025, we will see both dance and drama extended to Year 10. Media was offered as an elective to Years 7 and 8 for the first time this year and now extends to Year 12 as a general elective.



Our Academic Growth

PRIMARY

The year has seen some wonderful changes for our primary school campus!

New Campus

We were blessed to move into the new "Thomas Centre" Primary school campus and the improvements that this new physical environment has brought to our primary school community have been significant. Having a physical space where we are close to each other, allows for more collaboration and for our students to feel safe and have a stronger sense of belonging. The strong visibility around the school helps to reinforce positive behaviour as a result we are proud to have some of the best students around! We have been blessed with the playground, and are excited for the future as we look to expand our playing spaces, we all feel extremely blessed to have such a beautiful primary school space to learn and grow in.

2024 Initiatives

Nature Pedagogy | This year, we have integrated a nature pedagogy program into our curriculum, led by our resident Nature Pedagogy expert Mrs Cairns, who leads our sustainable garden project, our Waste Wise initiatives and our gardening club. There are numerous benefits to students having access to nature pedagogy, which are even more advantageous due to the rise of technology use in childhood.

Nature pedagogy, which focuses on learning through hands-on experiences in the natural world,

offers many benefits for children's development. It boosts physical health through active play, sharpens problem -solving skills and creativity, and supports emotional well-being by reducing stress and anxiety. It helps children of environment by building a direct Outdoor activities also strengthen social skills and while sensory experiences enhance their understanding of the world around

Nature-based learning encourages independence and builds confidence, giving children the space to take safe risks and explore new challenges. This approach fosters curiosity, inspiring a lifelong love of learning. Overall, nature pedagogy supports the growth of well-rounded, resilient children who appreciate and care for the natural world.

Dance | This year we introduced 2 new dance initiatives - Edudance and Jump Jam!

Jump Jam and EduDance have provided numerous benefits to our students this year, enhancing both physical and social skills. Jump Jam, with its high-energy dance routines, promotes physical fitness, coordination, and cardiovascular health. Students have enjoyed being active while learning new movements, building their stamina and motor skills in a fun, engaging way.

EduDance, on the other hand, offers a structured dance program that encourages creativity and self-expression. It allows students to



explore different dance styles and improve their rhythmic abilities. Both programs have also been valuable in fostering teamwork and building social connections, as students learn to work together, encourage one another, and celebrate their achievements as a group.

This year, we have seen a boost in students' confidence and enthusiasm for dance, along with improved fitness levels. These programs have not only kept students active but have also been a great way for them to connect and have fun together. And big congratulations to our Jump Jam Interschool Team, "The Kingalings", who took home the 3rd place trophy recent interschool the competition!

Academic Success | Our students have seen great success this year in NAPLAN results. We analysed students who have been with the College since 2022, and these students grew a huge 21 points on average, from below the national average in 2022, to way above the national average this year in writing, and made excellent gains across all areas. We believe this is testament to the excellent teaching practices our primary team have put in place, as well as our dedicated Responsive Education staff who are always seeking to push our students to reach their potential.

Enrolments | We are very proud of our enrolment growth, and are very excited to have waitlists in almost every year group in the primary school for 2025. This again is thanks to our wonderful staff, students and community who have made our school a school of choice. We have grown from around 285 students in 2022, to around 400 students enrolled for 2025. This is a huge achievement that we are extremely proud of.

SECONDARY

Learning and Teaching Report

The King's College is proud to celebrate the exceptional achievements of our students throughout this year. Both students and staff continue to grow and improve on our learning and teaching journey.

Year 12 Outcomes

This year's Year 12 Graduation Dinner and Graduation Service were remarkable celebrations of student success. It was a joy to see the Head of Year 12, Karin Au, present each Year 12 student on stage and announce their future pathways. Some of the notable achievements of our Year 12 students include:

- 15 students completed the Murdoch University TLC Enabling course, earning an ATAR equivalent score of 70.
- 7 students received early entry offers from universities.
- All Year 12 students enrolled in on -site VET courses completed their certificates, resulting in over 40 qualifications awarded.
- All students participating in VET Delivered in Secondary Schools (VETDSS) programs with South Metro TAFE and North Metro TAFE successfully completed their courses, leading to 16 certificates across various one-day-per-week VET programs.
- 97% of Year 12s achieved WACE graduation.
- More than 10 students are preparing to complete their final ATAR examinations later this year.

2024 Key Accomplishments

One of the key accomplishments of 2024 has been the improvement in how the College staff collect, store, analyse, and utilise academic data. we have historically Although gathered quality academic testing data, the increasing size of the school made sorting and analysing this information more challenging. The introduction of Elastik in 2024 has empowered teachers to analyse and apply data effectively, more

significantly impacting both Primary and Secondary education, especially in Literacy, Numeracy, and Science. Alongside enhanced data tracking, we have also consolidated and incrementally improved our literacy programs, NAPLAN performance, OLNA support, and existing teaching programs.

Tours and Missions | Another highlight of 2024 was the resumption of interstate and international tours post-COVID 19. The 2024 Canberra/ Sydney Academic Tour was fully booked, with 43 students and 5 staff members traveling to Canberra and Sydney in June. We are now preparing for the 2025 Fiji Immersion Tour, which will focus on Christian immersion experience. Moving forward, we plan to offer the Canberra Tour and the Christian Immersion Experience Tour in alternating years, with applications for the 2026 Canberra Tour opening early next year.

Extension Programs

Our Academic Extension Catalyst Program expanded to Year 9 in 2024, marking the first year we partnered with local universities for excursion activities. The program will extend into Year 10 in 2025. While Catalyst students complete the same number of assessments as those in mainstream WA Curriculum courses, they also have the opportunity to participate in extension tasks, engage in projectbased work, and develop critical thinking skills. Students in Year 6 may apply through a testing process, while students in Years 7 to 10 with strong results in Mathematics, English, Science, and HASS will be considered for Catalyst classes.

Elective Expansion

This year also saw the introduction of new electives and subject offerings, with a notable increase in students choosing Arts subjects.

The popularity of Dance, Drama, and Music has grown, leading to several outstanding performances. Our student music team once again hosted the Governor's Prayer Breakfast at Crown Entertainment, performing in front of hundreds of attendees and receiving rave reviews.

The new Dance room provided a professional rehearsal space for our students, and our Year 9 Dance award at YohFest demonstrated the progress in our Dance programs.

Additionally, the College's first full Drama production—Peter Pan and Alice in Wonderland—was a tremendous success, performing in front of a full house in the King's Chapel Auditorium.

A significant highlight this year has been the growth of the College's sporting teams. Our participation in the Rockingham Kwinana Associated Schools (RKAS) interschool sports competitions expanded, with Year 7 to 12 teams competing against other local schools in a wide range of sports.

The senior boys' RKAS volleyball team won their championship, and we were incredibly proud of the effort and spirit shown by all our competitors in extracurricular sporting events.



Honours Program

In 2024, we also launched the College Honours Program. Students can earn bronze, silver, and gold honours in the areas of Academics, Arts, Sports, and Citizenship. The program is designed to foster greater participation and achievement during students' time at the College, encouraging both individual accolades and House spirit. Students have been accumulating points across a diverse range of categories, and this year's awards assembly saw a large number of students proudly receiving their badges.

2025

Looking ahead to 2025, the Academic Council and teaching staff are planning for continued growth and improvement in teaching and learning. Key goals include:

- Developing a staff Learning and Teaching Playbook and enhancing support for students' post-school pathways.
- Strengthen our whole-school literacy approach, with the newly formed Literacy Committee working to integrate additional literacy strategies into the successful intervention model we currently use.

Careers Hub

This year saw the launch of the Careers Hub, a central location designed to empower parents and students to access information, tools, events and resources to assist them in navigating career aspirations and pathways.

Careers Tasters

Our Year 9 students were treated to a career exposure incursion from Yalagan Group Training this week.

The King's College has a strong partnership with the Kwinana Industries Council (KIC). The KIC Education Development Program (EDP) was created to improve this understanding, and to create pathways for the students in the region's high schools to enter the industrial workforce.

Through the partnership between The King's College and The Kwinana Industries Council, "iPrograms" are offered to Year 10 students enabling them to explore careers and occupations that they would not hear about otherwise.

Work Experience Program
