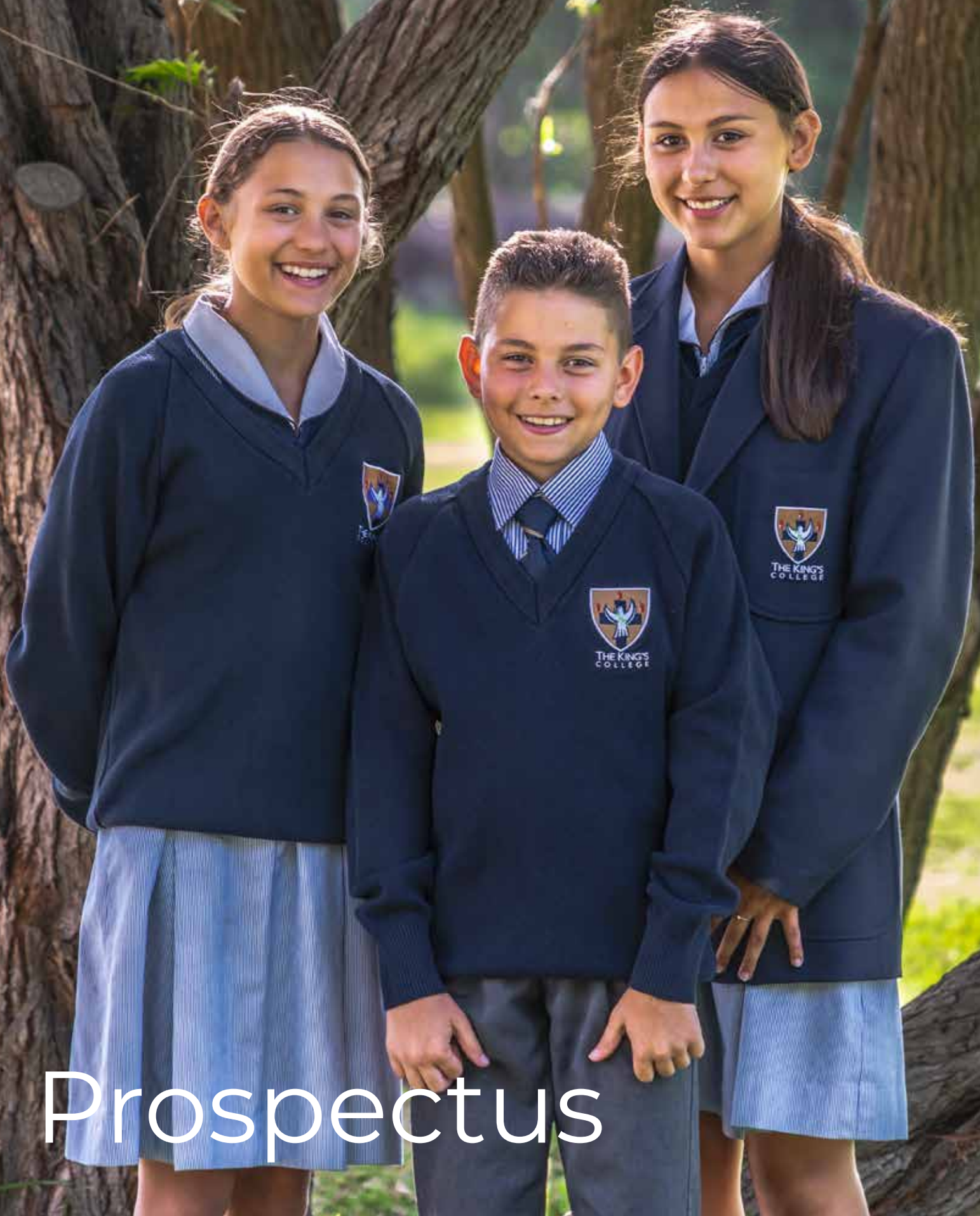

Pre-Kindergarten to Pre-Primary

The King's College takes pride in creating a secure and stimulating place where your child can thrive through curiosity and imagination in their early school years.

The College places emphasis on helping your child to become literate and numerate as soon as possible.

The aim is for each child to have fun in their first years of school and to make friends, gain confidence, learn through play, and know that God loves them.

In 2023 we are offering a full day pre-kindy for children who have turned 3, each Friday. Our kindergarten program for 4 year olds will run 4 days per week, from Monday to Thursday.

Years 1 to 6

In the formative years of primary school at The King's College, our experienced staff help your child explore and extend their God-given talents and abilities, introducing them to new concepts, skills, and interests. We believe that every child can excel at something. Through individual successes, your child builds confidence and gains achievements across the learning spectrum, further enhancing their capabilities

Our teachers provide high impact, evidence-based teaching using Explicit Direct Instruction (EDI). This approach significantly improves achievement for all students, including English language learners and students with special needs.

We encourage students to develop skills of investigation and inquiry to enhance their creativity and problem-solving skills.

We provide a positive and supportive environment for the students to grow as confident and independent learners - spiritually, intellectually, physically, emotionally, artistically, and socially.

Our K-12 College allows for specialist staff to teach in the primary school in areas such as: Physical Education, Art, Music, and Technology.

Secondary School

Year 7-12

The King's College provides a rewarding and challenging secondary education for Year 7 to 12 students. Within the safe and nurturing Christian environment of the College, your child is encouraged to become an independent and respectful learner with compassion and integrity. Students benefit from a diverse curriculum and rich selection of specialist programs in which to take part.

Year 7-10 Curriculum

The curriculum is designed to assist and encourage your child to think critically and find their passion. All students study English, Literacy, Mathematics, Science, HASS, Physical Education and Health. Students also study a range of elective options including Food Science, Digital Technologies, Woodwork, Outdoor Education, Visual Art, Photography, Dance and Music.

Year 11-12 Curriculum

As a priority, every student is placed in courses that maximise their ability to graduate with the Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE). There are two main pathways in Years 11 and 12:

ATAR

Students aiming for direct university entrance. This requires external examinations in at least four ATAR subjects. Students can select subjects from a range of learning areas.

ACCESS

Students aiming for TAFE, employment, or possible alternative entry to university. There are many possible subject selections, including General courses, VET and Certificate courses and ATAR courses. Students may elect to study the Murdoch University TLC bridging course while at the College to achieve direct entry into university.





Gifted and Talented

The King's College recognises gifted and talented students and seeks to work closely with children with high academic or creative abilities to assist them in expressing their full potential.

Primary

The College offers two Extension Programmes to students in Pre-Primary to Year 6 who are achieving at an academic level in the top range of their year group.

The Ace Program (Pre-Primary – Year 2) and **Newton Programs** (Years 3 – 6) aim to foster creative problem-solving and critical thinking skills in selected students at the College who have demonstrated high academic potential. Students will be taught to approach problems analytically and creatively with specific skills and processes, thereby developing academic rigour and attributes that will boost their learning in all their subject areas.

In addition, working within a group of similar high-ability students can build supportive relationships with other like-minds and reduce the possibility of isolation, which can sometimes occur with students of high ability. Also, where students are showing extremely high potential and under the guidance of the school psychologist, they may be considered for grade acceleration.

Secondary

Catalyst: Academic Extension Program

Our Catalyst program aims to extend students in the areas of Mathematics, English, Science and Humanities. Students are encouraged to collaborate and use their critical thinking skills. These courses are a great way for students to positively progress towards their future studies. Students are selected for the four Catalyst programs based on their school report, NAPLAN results and the College Catalyst and Scholarship test.

All primary and secondary students are given the opportunity to participate in a number of competitions, such as Optiminds, Da Vinci Decathlon and other local competitions.



Responsive Education

Responsive Education is a new perspective on responding to individual students with special needs who can integrate into mainstream classrooms with adjustments. We utilise a 3-wave response system and a 'lighthouse' structure to support differentiation and empower our teachers to adjust learning so students can access the curriculum and achieve their learning potential.

We have been recognised as a specialist intervention school focusing on core literacy and numeracy skills and Apple digital accessibility tools, which align with current cognitive science to ensure positive school engagement.

We have a team of dynamic education specialists, including a Director of Responsive Education, Secondary Responsive Education Coordinator, Responsive Education Teacher and Lighthouse Keeper, Assistant Head of Primary Well-Being and a team of Special Education Assistants.

Our Responsive education learning environments include 21st-century flexible learning spaces such as our sensory room, therapy room, Lighthouse Studio in secondary and Lighthouse break-out areas in our primary. These 5-star learning spaces support synergy between our pastoral care and curriculum teams supporting individual education tracking for students at educational risk and sensory and emotional regulation.

How to Enrol at The King's College

At The King's College, an early enrolment application is always recommended to guarantee a place within our safe and nurturing Christian environment. Follow the simple steps below to enrol today and be part of a caring and supportive community:

Application

Complete the Enrolment Form and return it to the College. A \$60 non-refundable application fee is payable. Please provide your child's birth certificate, immunisation record, two most recent school reports and NAPLAN results (if applicable).

Interview

The principal considers the application and will arrange a time for a family interview on campus.

Offer

If successful, a formal Letter of Offer will be sent along with other documents for signing.

Confirmation

Placement will be confirmed on completion and return of all documents, including the Letter of Offer. An enrolment fee of \$500.00 (non-refundable) is also payable. The enrolment fee is capped at \$800.00 per family if you have multiple children you are applying for at the same time.
